II. Finals

• Reporting Rules:

- o Teams will be allotted equipment for 30 minutes each day.
- o Reporting must cover events between 9 AM and 5 PM.
- o Main stage reporting is not allowed.
- o Teams may choose the events they wish to cover, take interviews, and report ongoing activities as they find suitable.

• Submission Guidelines:

- o Submit video clippings and a report covering all three days of activities.
- o Video clippings must be submitted day-wise to the coordinator before 6 PM.
- o Basic video editing is allowed.



- Additional Rules:
 - o No obscenity or inappropriate behaviour is allowed in the video.
 - o Equipment must be handled carefully; any damage will be penalized.
- Judging and Disqualification:
 - o The decision of the judge will be final and binding.
 - o Any team violating the rules will be disqualified.

CALL - BREAK

RULES

- **Number of Players:** Call Break is played with 4 players using a standard 52-card deck.
- **Objective:** The goal is to win the exact number of tricks (or more) called during the bidding phase.
- Card Ranking: The cards rank from Ace (highest) to 2 (lowest). Spades are always the trump suit.
- **Dealing:** Each player is dealt 13 cards, one card at a time in clockwise order.

• Bidding:

- 1. Each player declares the minimum number of tricks they aim to win in a clockwise manner.
- 2. The bids are made before gameplay starts and cannot be changed.

· Gameplay:

- 3. The player to the dealer's right leads the first trick.
- 4. Players must follow suit if possible. If they cannot, they may play any card, including a trump card (spade).
- 5. The highest trump wins the trick. If no trumps are played, the highest card of the suit led wins.

• Scoring:

- 6.If a player wins at least the number of tricks they bid, they score points equal to their bid.
- 7. For every extra trick won, they score 0.1 additional points.
- 8. If a player fails to meet their bid, they lose points equal to their bid.
- **Rounds:** The game is usually played over 5 rounds. The player with the highest total score at the end wins.
- **Tie-Breaker:** If there's a tie, an additional round can be played to determine the winner.
- **Penalties:** Any violations, such as bidding less than 1 or showing cards intentionally, result in penalties or disqualification.

RULES

- **Number of Players :** Each game features 100 players divided into 25 squads, with each squad consisting of 4 players only.

• Round 1: Tied Leg Sprint

Setup: The adjacent legs of both team members (e.g., left leg of one and right leg of the other) will be tied together.

Task: Teams must race from a starting point to an endpoint.

• Rules:

- 1. Teams must maintain the tie throughout the race.
- 2. Falling or losing the tie leads to disqualification.
- 3. Top 10 teams with the fastest completion times qualify for the second round.

Round 2: Blind Maze Challenge

Setup: One team member will be the *Guide* (who can see the maze), while the other will be the *Runner* (who will be blindfolded).

Task: The Guide must navigate the blindfolded Runner verbally through the maze.

• Rules:

- 1. Roles:
- Guide: Gives only verbal directions to the Runner.
- Runner: Blindfolded and must strictly follow the Guide's instructions.
- 2. Time Limit: Each team will get 10-15 minutes to complete the maze. Teams that fail to finish in this time will be disqualified.
- 3. No Peeking: The Runner cannot see the maze at any point.
- 4. No Physical Assistance : The Guide cannot physically assist the Runner in any way.
- 5. Winning: The team with the fastest time to complete the maze wins.
